Forney City Council Tuesday, March 3, 2020 6:00 p.m. Regular Meeting and Work Shop City Hall, 101 E. Main Street, Forney, Texas 75126

I. **CALL TO ORDER**

Mayor Penn called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. Present were Mayor Mary Penn, Mayor Pro Tem Shaun Myers and Council Members Mike Thomas, Robbie Powers, Kevin Moon, Derald Cooper and David Johnson. Also present was City Manager Tony Carson.

1. **National Reading Month**

Mayor Penn read the Proclamation.

IV. **APPROVAL OF MINUTES**

1. Consider approval of the Minutes of the February 4, 2020, City Council meeting.

Mayor Penn asked if Council had any changes to the Minutes. There being no changes, Mayor Penn called for a motion. Council Member Moon made a motion to approve the Minutes and Council Member Cooper seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously by a vote of 7 ayes and 0 nays.

V. **CONSENT AGENDA**

The items on the Consent Agenda are considered to be self-explanatory by the Council and will be enacted in one motion. There will be no separate discussion of these items unless requested by a Council Member.]

- 1. Consider a Resolution approving a Professional Services Agreement with Freeman-Millican, Inc. for providing engineering services for electrical improvements at Pump Station No. 2.
- 2. Consider a Resolution authorizing continued participation with the Steering Committee of Cities served by Oncor and authorizing the payment of membership dues to fund regulatory and related activities related to the Oncor Electric Delivery Company, LLC.
- 3. Consider approval of the authorization to allow staff to seek bids for the street maintenance and repairs, and all related issues.
- 4. Consider a Resolution approving a Special Warranty Deed conveying 0.268 acres of land originally dedicated as parkland in error as part of an original 67.44 acres of land by Meadow Ridge Farm, LP and authorizing the City Manager to execute a Special Warranty Deed on behalf of the City.

5. Consider a Resolution approving a Temporary Construction Access Easement between the City of Forney and Union Pacific Railroad Company for a period of five months for railroad bridge construction and re-construction projects within the railroad right-of-way located in the Mineola Subdivision of the railroad.

Mayor Penn asked if Council wished to pull and item for discussion. No items were pulled and no one from the audience came forward to speak on an item, so Mayor Penn called for a motion. Council Member Johnson made a motion to approve the entire Consent Agenda and Mayor Pro Tem Myers seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously by a vote of 7 ayes and 0 nays.

VIII. **COUNCIL COMMENTS**

Council Member Thomas had no comments.

Mayor Pro Tem Myers thanked Staff for their hard work.

Council Member Powers stated she was glad to be back after being out sick at our last meeting. She asked that everyone to keep the Givens Family in their prayers.

Council Member Moon stated he is looking forward to the work shop.

Council Member Cooper had no comments.

Council Member Johnson had no comments.

Mayor Penn stated she received a call from the Mayor of Terrell congratulating the City with regard to Amazon.

Mayor Penn called for a 10-minute recess at this time.

IX. **WORK SHOP**

Mayor Penn called the meeting back to order at 6:14 p.m. City Manager Tony Carson gave a brief review of the goals of the Council from the last workshop in 2018 and what has been accomplished by the City. City Attorney Jon Thatcher presented the topics for discussion during the evening's workshop including the City's park system, the Booker T Washington school site, and the City's growth management plan.

109 The Council discussed the next phases of the City's park system and directed staff to start the 110 process for a possible bond election to support the development of the City's park system including 111 Community Park, Northside Park and the Pinson Heritage Park. 112 113 Council Member Powers left the meeting at 6:30 p.m. 114 115 The Council then discussed the Booker T Washington school. The consensus of the Council was 116 that the facility is not safe and needs to be addressed this year. Staff will work on drafting a 117 Reguest for Proposals to perform work at the site. Potential development for the property could 118 include a memorial and pavilion for public use. Further discussions about the property will occur at 119 a later date. 120 121 The Council concluded the workshop with a discussion about measures to help bring a diverse 122 development to the City with a variety of residential options maintaining a focus on development of 123 infrastructure and commercial growth. The City's Comprehensive Land Use Plan was identified as 124 an item for staff to review and formulate a plan for its update. 125 126 Finance Director Deborah Woodham provided response to guestions about the impact of a bond 127 election on the average citizen of the City. As an example, Ms. Woodham stated that the annual 128 tax increase for a potential \$140 million bond would be just under \$1,000. 129 130 There being no further discussion, Mayor Penn called for a motion to adjourn. Mayor Pro Tem 131 Myers made a motion to adjourn the meeting at 7:30 p.m. and Council Member Moon seconded 132 the motion. The motion passed by a vote of 6 ayes and 1 absent. 133 134 PASSED AND APPROVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FORNEY, 135
