15 Mayor Lewis called the meeting to order at 6:32 p.m. Present were Mayor Amanda Lewis, Mayor
16 Pro Tem James Traylor and Council Members Cecil Chambers, Sandi Primous, Sarah Salgado,
17 Zahnd Schlenker and Jason Roberson. Also present was City Manager Charles Daniels.

18
19 **II. INVOCATION AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE – COUNCIL MEMBER ZAHND SCHLENSKER**

21 Nick Edwards gave the invocation and Council Member Schlenker led the Pledge of Allegiance.

23 **III. PROCLAMATIONS / PRESENTATIONS**

25 **1. Proclamation for Parks and Recreation Month**

27 Mayor Lewis read the Parks and Recreation Month Proclamation and presented it to Parks and
28 Recreation staff: Kyle Rouvaldt, Director and Ron Brock, Rob Riggs, David Hockett, and Special
29 Events Coordinator Ricky Hoelscher.

31 **IV. APPROVAL OF MINUTES**

32
33 **1. Consider approval of the Minutes of the May 18, 2022, Special Meeting**
34 **to Canvass the General Election.**

35
36 Mayor Lewis asked if Council had any changes to the minutes. There being no changes, Mayor
37 Lewis called for a motion. Council Member Schlenker made a motion to approve the Minutes of
38 the May 18, 2022, Special Meeting and Council Member Chambers seconded the motion. The
39 motion passed by a vote of 5 ayes and 2 abstain [Primous and Traylor].

40
41 **2. Consider approval of the Minutes of the June 7, 2022, City Council**
42 **meeting.**

43
44 Mayor Lewis asked if Council had any changes to the minutes. There being no changes, Mayor
45 Lewis called for a motion. Council Member Schlenker made a motion to approve the Minutes of
46 the June 7, 2022, meeting and Council Member Salgado seconded the motion. The motion
47 passed by a vote of 6 ayes and 1 abstain [Primous].

49 **3. Consider approval of the Minutes of the June 14, 2022, Special Joint**
50 **Meeting with the Planning and Zoning Commission.**

52 Mayor Lewis asked if Council had any changes to the minutes. There being no changes, Mayor
53 Lewis called for a motion. Council Member Schlensker made a motion to approve the Minutes of
54 the June 14, 2022, meeting and Mayor Pro Tem Traylor seconded the motion. The motion passed
55 by a vote of 6 ayes and 1 abstain [Primous].

60 Mayor Lewis asked if Council had any changes to the minutes. There being no changes, Mayor
61 Lewis called for a motion. Council Member Schlensker made a motion to approve the Minutes of
62 the June 14, 2022, meeting and Mayor Pro Tem Traylor seconded the motion. The motion passed
63 by a vote of 5 ayes and 2 abstain [Primous and Roberson].

105 Mayor Lewis read the items on the Consent Agenda and asked if Council wanted to pull any items
106 for discussion. Council Member Schlensker requested that Consent Agenda Item No. 2 be pulled.
107 Council Member Salgado requested that Consent Agenda Item No. 1 be pulled. Council Member
108 Primous requested that Consent Agenda Item No. 6 be pulled. Mayor Lewis called for a motion
109 on the remaining Consent Agenda Items, numbers 3, 4 and 5. Council Member Schlensker made
110 a motion to approve Consent Agenda Items No. 3, 4 and 5 and Council Member Salgado
111 seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously by a vote of 7 ayes and 0 nays.

112
113 Consent Agenda Item No. 1 -- *Consider a Resolution approving a contract with WRA Architects*
114 *Inc. to provide consulting and design services for the Police Station Dispatch Renovation Project*
115 *and all related issues.* City Engineer Karl Zook discussed this item. This renovation project will
116 expand the dispatch area to enable more employees and give them more room. The cost is
117 approximately \$750,000. Mayor Lewis called for a motion on Consent Agenda Item No. 1.
118 Council Member Schlensker made a motion to approve Consent Agenda Item No. 1 and Council
119 Member Chambers seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously by a vote of 7 ayes
120 and 0 nays.

121
122 Consent Agenda Item No. 2 -- *Consider a Resolution awarding a contract to Hydromax USA, LLC*
123 *for the Fire Hydrant Maintenance Project and all related issues.* Public Works Director Kyle
124 Groves discussed this item. Groves stated that he knew Hydromax before this bid. Although
125 their bid at \$87,000 was the lowest, he feels that they will do a good job. Mayor Lewis called for
126 a motion on Consent Agenda Item No. 2. Council Member Schlensker made a motion to approve
127 Consent Agenda Item No. 2 and Council Member Salgado seconded the motion. The motion
128 passed unanimously by a vote of 7 ayes and 0 nays.

129
130 Consent Agenda Item No. 6 -- *Consider approval of a new Grant Writer position.* City Manager
131 Daniels discussed this item. This is a new position for the City and that grant writer will
132 aggressively seek grants for the City. Funding for this position will come from current fiscal year
133 salary savings. Mayor Lewis called for a motion. Council Member Salgado made a motion to
134 approve Consent Agenda Item No. 6 and Mayor Pro Tem Traylor seconded the motion. The
135 motion passed unanimously by a vote of 7 ayes and 0 nays.

136 137 **VII. DISCUSSION / ACTION ITEMS**

138 139 **1. Discuss and consider action regarding a Resolution approving** 140 **a Reimbursement Agreement between Union Pacific Railroad** 141 **Company and the City of Forney.**

142
143 Prior to discussion of this item, Mayor Lewis stated that this was previously listed as item 1(b)
144 under Executive Session Items on the June 21, 2022 agenda. City Engineer Karl Zook discussed
145 this item. Zook stated that for this to be a public crossing the agreement had to be between Union
146 Pacific Railroad and the City. HEB will reimburse the City dollar-for-dollar for the review by Union
147 Pacific. We will bring the HEB agreement to the next Council meeting for approval. Mayor Lewis
148 called for a motion. Council Member Chambers made a motion to approve the Resolution with
149 the stipulation that there is a written agreement with HEB. Council Member Schlensker seconded
150 the motion. The motion passed unanimously by a vote of 7 ayes and 0 nays.

151 152 **2. Discussion of the updated bond projects and possible action.**

153
154 The WRA representative presented each bond project and gave updated numbers on the cost for
155 each project.

156

157 No. 1 is Public Safety Facilities: Fire Station No. 2 Expansion, New Fire Station No. 1 and New
158 Fire Station No. 3.

159
160 Number 2 is Parks & Recreation, which includes the new Northside Park and Community Park
161 Phase 2.

162
163 Number 3 is the Recreation Center.

164
165 Number 4 is the Library/Community/Senior Center.

166
167 Number 5 is Streets and Infrastructure.

168
169 They are waiting on guidance from the Bond Counsel.

170
171 It was determined that Council would hold a work session next week on Tuesday, July 12, 2022,
172 to discuss and finalize the bond projects.

173
174 **3. Discuss and consider a Resolution approving a Development**
175 **Agreement between the City of Forney and Blue Ladder Holdings,**
176 **LLC for the development of certain improvements to be made to**
177 **Pinson Road at US Highway 80 services road within the City of**
178 **Forney.**

179
180 City Attorney Jenni Barnes Smith came forward to discuss this item. This Development
181 Agreement was previously presented to the City on May 3, 2022 and was denied. The agreement
182 has been revised and is being presented to the Council again for their consideration. This only
183 relates to improvements to Pinson Road and has nothing to do with the zoning on the 46.463
184 acres.

185
186 Mayor Lewis called for a motion. Mayor Pro Tem Traylor made a motion to approve the
187 Development Agreement and Council Member Primous seconded the motion. The motion
188 passed by a vote of 4 ayes [Schlensker, Roberson, Traylor and Primous] and 3 nays [Lewis,
189 Salgado and Chambers].

190
191 **4. Discuss and consider action on a Resolution approving an**
192 **expenditure under Section 501.073 Texas Local Government Code**
193 **and a Performance Agreement between the Forney Economic**
194 **Development Corporation and Forney TPS Hotel, LP dba TownePlace**
195 **Suites by Marriott.**

196
197 City Attorney Jennie Barnes Smith discussed this item. This Performance Agreement between
198 the FEDC and Forney TPS Hotel, LP dba TownePlace Suites by Marriott was approved at the
199 FEDC's regular meeting on March 17, 2022. The City must approve any expenditure of FEDC
200 funds pursuant to Section 501.073 Texas Local Government Code before any grant is made.

201
202 The developer will be responsible for the construction of the necessary infrastructure and a
203 minimum of 50,000 square feet of hotel space and 2,500 square feet of meeting space on the
204 property.

205
206 Mayor Lewis called for a motion. Mayor Pro Tem Traylor made a motion to approve the
207 Resolution and Council Member Schlensker seconded the motion. The motion passed
208 unanimously by a vote of 7 ayes and 0 nays.

209

210 **5. Discuss and consider action on a Resolution approving an**
211 **expenditure under Section 501.073 Texas Local Government Code**
212 **and a Performance Agreement between the Forney Economic**
213 **Development Corporation and Victory at Forney, L.L.C. regarding**
214 **Project Graduation Dinner.**
215

216 Jennie Barnes Smith discussed this item. A Performance Agreement between the FEDC and
217 Victory at Forney, L.L.C was approved at the FEDC's regular meeting on March 17, 2022. The
218 City must approve any expenditure of FEDC funds pursuant to Section 501.073 Texas Local
219 Government Code before any grant is made.
220

221 The developer will be responsible for the construction of the necessary infrastructure and a
222 minimum of 4,600 square feet of restaurant space on the property.
223

224 It was announced that this will be an Outback Steak House.
225

226 Mayor Lewis called for a motion. Mayor Pro Tem Traylor made a motion to approve the
227 Resolution approving an expenditure under Section 501.073 Texas Local Government Code and
228 a Performance Agreement between the Forney Economic Development Corporation and Victory
229 at Forney, L.L.C. for the building of an Outback Steak House. Council Member Roberson
230 seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously by a vote of 7 ayes and 0 nays.
231

232 **6. Discuss and consider board and commission appointments: Animal**
233 **Adoption Center/Shelter Advisory Committee; Board of Adjustment;**
234 **Building Standards Commission Board; Economic Development**
235 **Corporation; Historic Overlay District Architectural Review Board;**
236 **Park and Recreation Board; and the Planning and Zoning**

239 Mayor Lewis stated she would be starting with the largest boards that have a lot of interest.

THE CITY MANAGER WILL DISCUSS CURRENT CITY ACTIVITIES, UPCOMING MEETINGS, FUTURE LEGISLATIVE ACTIVITIES, AND OTHE RELATED MATTERS FOR POSSIBLE ACTION, INCLUDING THE FOLLOWING:

On Saturday, July 2nd, the city hosted its annual Independence Day Celebration. The event had a great turnout and was a success. I’d like to thank the parks and recreation department as well as public works, police, and fire for working this event and making it possible for our residents. It was estimated that there approximately 24,000 people in attendance.

417 The Fire Department concluded interviews for open firefighter positions last week and was able
418 to extend conditional offers of employment to eight candidates. They will begin their onboarding
419 process quickly and are projected to begin New Hire Orientation Training on Monday August 8th.
420 If all are successful, the Fire Department will have all authorized positions fully staffed for the first
421 time in several years.

422
423 The city has recently posted a Grant Coordinator position. This position will be responsible for
424 researching, writing, and applying for grants from governmental agencies, private foundations,
425 corporations, and individual grantors. This position will be a great resource for our city.

426
427 The City of Forney and CWD will be providing a FREE paper shredding event for Forney residents
428 on Saturday, July 16th. The event will take place at Forney Community Park from 8 a.m. to 11
429 a.m.

430
431 Mayor Pro Tem Traylor thanked the Forney PD for giving his wife a ticket. The officer was very
432 nice and she had positive comments about the experience.

433
434 Council Member Schlensker welcomed Chief White.

435

488 Council returned to Chambers at 9:08 p.m. Mayor Lewis called for a motion to adjourn out of
489 Executive Session at that time. Mayor Pro Tem Traylor made a motion to adjourn out of Executive
490 Session and Council Member Chambers seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously
491 by a vote of 7 ayes and 0 nays.

493 As a result of Executive Session, Mayor Lewis asked for a motion to join the North Texas
494 Municipal Water District's pleading against the City of Heath regarding the Buffalo Creek
